The Tzotzil are an indigenous Maya people of the central Chiapas highlands in southern Mexico. As of 2000, they numbered about 298,000. The municipalities with largest Tzotzil population are Chamula (48,500), San Cristóbal de las Casas (30,700), and Zinacantan (24,300), in the Mexican state of Chiapas. The Aztecs (/ ˈ æ z t ɜ k s /) were a Mesoamerican culture that flourished in central Mexico in the post-classic period from 1300 to 1521.
